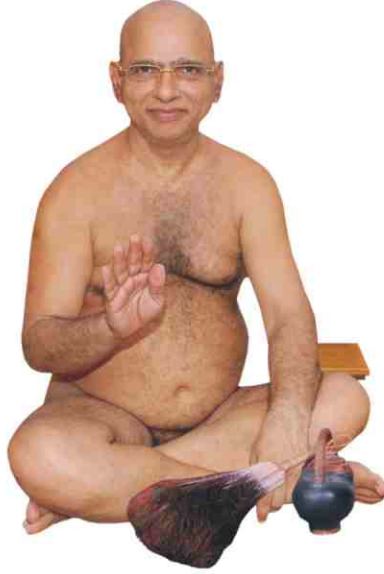

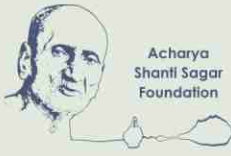

Formation of Trust

However, Jainism had lost its true form in India in the recent centuries. It was the determination of Acharya Shri 108 Shanti Sagar ji Maharaj to follow and spread Digambar Jain tradition in its true and original form and his relentless efforts revived the religion once again. The Muni Deeksha ceremony of Acharya Shri 108 Shanti Sagar ji Maharaj was conducted at Yarnal, Karnataka in the year 1920 and the centenary celebrations to commemorate the same was planned. Acharya Shanti Sagar Foundation is a non-profit organization formed to plan, execute and overlook the celebrations and all the activities thereafter.

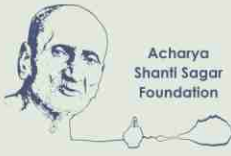

The trust deed was registered on 6th day of February, 2019 having its registered office at Golden Enclave, Corporate Block, Tower B1, 5th Floor, HAL Old Airport Road, Bengaluru – 560 017.

1. To restore the monumental ruins, the renovation of temples, and other Jain religious monuments of historical and architectural importance.

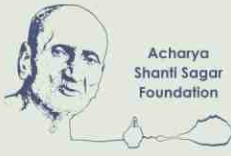

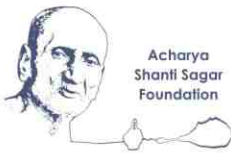
TEMPLE RENOVATION

To avoid duplication of efforts and optimization of resources Acharya Shanti Sagar Foundation joined hands with “**Shree Bharatvarashiya Digambar Jain Tirth Sanrakshini Mahasabha, Delhi**” to undertake renovation of ruined and damaged temples, across the country.

Temple renovation completed:

1. **1008 Shri Parshwanath Temple, Malgalgi village, Chincholi tq., Gulbarga dist., Karnataka**
 - a. Malgalgi is located 55km from Gulbarga, East Side and 28 km from Malkhed.
 - b. This temple belongs to the time of Rashtra Koot and Chalukya of 9th century.
 - c. Main idol of 1008 Shri Parshwanath Bhagwan is approximately 8 feet.
 - d. Also, Dharnendra Yaksh Chaturbhuj statue was found and this type of idols are rarely found.
 - e. At the time of survey, this temple was found in a very pathetic condition without boundary wall, ceiling and flooring in an open place. Idols were lying on the ground in complete deteriorated condition.
 - f. This temple was immediately taken up for renovation in plot (temple) size of 1650 sq. ft.

2. 1008 Shri Parshwanath Temple, Gadikeshwar village, Chincholi tq., Gulbarga dist., Karnataka

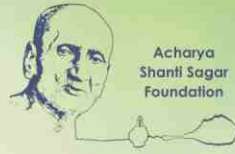
- Gadikeshwar it is located 55 KM towards East from District headquarters Gulbarga. 21 KM from Chincholi.
- This temple belongs to the time of Rashtrakutas and Chalukya of 9th century.
- Main idol of 1008 Shri Parshwanath Bhagwan is approximately 5 feet.
- At the time of survey, this temple was found in a very pathetic condition. Though statue was found inside temple, the idol was in very poor condition.
- This temple was immediately taken up for renovation with a plot (temple) size of 1000 sq.ft.



3. 1008 Shri Parshwanath Temple, Sulepeth village, Chincholi tq., Gulbarga dist., Karnataka

- Gadikeshwar it is located 73 KM towards East from District headquarters Gulbarga. This temple belongs to the time of Rashtrakutas and Chalukya of 9th century.
- Main idol of Bhagwan 1008 Shri Parshwanath is approx. 4 feet.
- At the time of survey, this temple was found in a very pathetic condition.
- This temple was immediately taken up for renovation with a plot (temple) size of 700 sq.ft.

1. Construction of Shanti Ashram at Yarnal, Karnataka

Yarnal is a village in Hukkeri Taluka of Belagavi district which comes under Hosur Gram Panchayat. It is located 44 kms from Belagavi which is the district headquarters, 10 kms from Hukkeri, the Taluka Headquarter and 561 kms from Bangalore, Karnataka State.

On 20th March 1920, Acharya Shri 108 Shanti Sagarji Maharaj took Digambar Muni Deeksha at Yarnal. Acharya Shantisagar Foundation is celebrating the Deeksha Centenary of Acharya Shree Shantisagarji Maharaj, for the whole year 2019 - 2020, throughout the country.

In light of Yarnal being the Deeksha Sthal of Acharya Shri 108 Shanti Sagarji Maharaj, Acharya Shantisagar Foundation has drafted detailed plans for the upliftment of the people and the development of Yarnal. As part of this plan, a **Shanti Ashram** is constructed having a built-up area of 10,122 sq. ft., along with a dining hall and kitchen. This building will be used primarily to accommodate Jain Sadhus and Sadhvis and hundreds of devotees who are visiting Yarnal.



Shri Ratanlal Kanwarlal Patni Foundation of R.K. Marbles, Kishangarh has mainly contributed for the construction of this Shanti Ashram.

At present in Shanti Ashram Acharya Shri 108 Vardhman Sagar ji Maharaj and his Sangh are performing their Chaturmas.

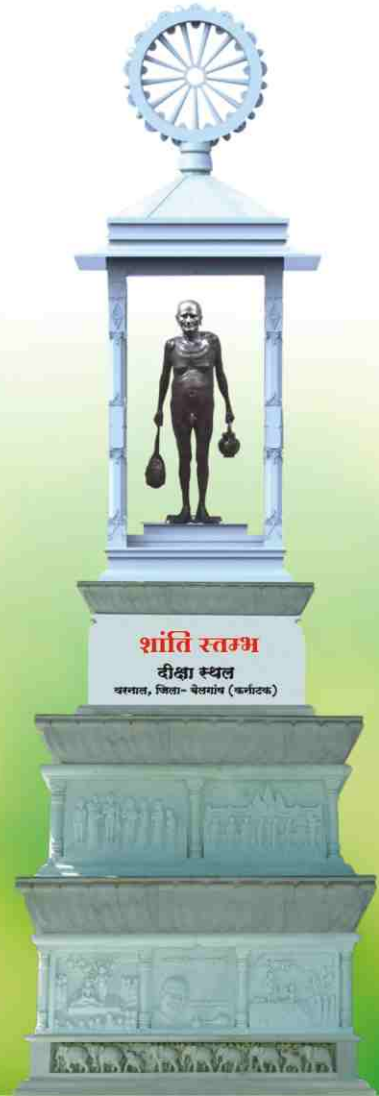
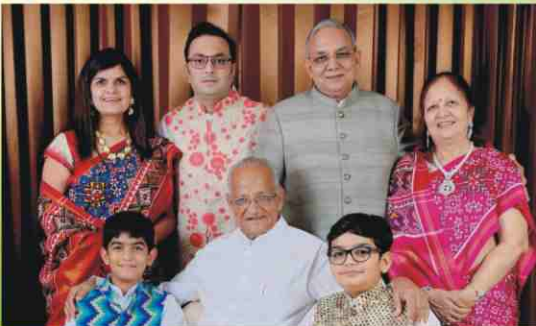


2. Construction of Shanti Stambh at Yarnal

Shanti Stambh is constructed in the memory of **Prathamacharya Charitra Chakravarthi 108 Shri Shantisagarji Maharaj**. A life size Statue of Acharya Shri 108 Shanti Sagar ji Maharaj is installed on top of the stambh and on all the four sides of the stambh, life history (jeevancharitra) of Acharya Shatisagarji Maharaj is engraved.

Shri Shobhag Mal Rajendra Kumar ji Katariya of Ahmedabad, Gujarat has mainly contributed for the Construction of Shanti Stambh. Lokarpan of Shanti Stambh was performed on 8th Feb, 2020 by Rajashri Padmavibhushan Dr. D. Veerendra Heggade Dharmadhikari, Dharmasthala, in the holy presence of Archarya Shri 108 Vardhaman Sagar ji Maharaj and his Sangh, along with many other Acharyas and Sangh.

Also, Poojya Jagadguru Swastishri Charukirthi Bhattarak Mahaswami ji of Shravanabelagola, Poojya Jagadguru Swastishri Devendra Keerthi Bhattarak Mahaswami ji of Humcha, Poojya Jagadguru Swastishri Jinasen Bhattarak Mahaswami ji of Nandani and other Bhattarak Swami ji has made their gracious presence in the function.



3. Renovation of Community Hall at Yarnal

The existing Jain community hall was many years old and was in a deteriorating condition. It required immediate attention and repair works to make it usable.

Considering the importance and utility of this deteriorating community hall, ASSF took up the renovation and modification work to convert the hall to serve as library, conducting cultural activities, family gatherings, etc. to be used by the village members.



4. Construction of Staff quarters and toilet blocks for school at Yarnal

The Bharatiya Rural Development Foundation, Hosur is running;

1. Adarsh Kannada Medium Convent School, and
2. Akkappa Naik Industrial Training Centre

The school is having 337 students training centre and staff strength of 12, the ITI is having 82 students and total staff strength of 08 Members.

- a. School management informed Acharya Shanti Sagar Foundation that their staff members were not having proper accommodation at Hosur and they have to commute from far off places to reach the school on time. In view of this, they requested ASSF that one of their buildings could be modified in such a way that it becomes suitable for their staff to be accommodated appropriately. Also, they had put up a request for the construction of toilet blocks in the school as they were not having the same in the school premises.

The foundation having understood the genuineness of the issue and after conducting a detailed study of the existing structure, created 14 rooms within the building by providing suitable partitions as per the requirement of the school.

- b. The ASSF team were in utter shock, as they observed that there were no proper toilets in the institution and especially for the female students and staff members. Considering the urgent need, ASSF constructed a separate toilet block with 2 no. of Indian WC, 3 no. of EWC, 4 showers, 5 basins with tiles and color coated G.I. roofing. Also, a septic tank for waste disposal, apvc/pvc piping, water tank for storages, fibre doors were provided in the school premises in 2 parts to be used separately by male and female members.

5. Undertaken by Govt. on persuasion by ASSF at Yarnal

As a result of continuous efforts and persuasion with the State Government, Acharya Shantisagar Foundation has succeeded in initiating works for the expansion of basic infrastructure in Yarnal Village in such a short span of time. These significant tasks include works related to conversing kaccha single lane road to double N.H. standard road, drainage, high mast lighting, toilets and a paver road connecting Chandraprabhu Tirthankar Jinalaya. The State Government is spending approx. Rs. 25 crores for upliftment of infrastructure of Yarnal village.

6. Sri Chandraprabha Jain Mandir, Yarnal, Karnataka

This is an ancient temple built in 13th century existing at the present temple premises. This temple was renovated and reconstructed in 1920. Panchkalyan of this reconstructed temple was done by the local Shravaks under the guidance and blessings of Poojya Devendrakirti (Devappa) Swami ji. It was during this Panchkalyan, Shantisagar ji took Muni Deeksha from Devendrakirti Swami ji near the place where Brahmadeva Temple is situated presently. The temple is a beautifully carved structure built of locally available white Arabhavi stone. The main attraction of the temple is the regal entrance gateway. The reconstruction of the temple began in 1942 and was completed in 1986. It was undertaken by Shri Dharnyappa Chandappa Chougule. The ground floor has an idol of Bhagwan Chandraprabhu Tirthankar which was installed a few decades ago while the first floor of the temple has the idol of Bhagwan Mahaveer Tirthankar which was installed in 1964.

The first floor was constructed with the support of Shri Sukumar Patil and family a local devotee. The original idol of Bhagwan Chandraprabhu Tirthankar which was at the ground floor was shifted to the second floor and installed in the Shikhar. There is a courtyard which also has a majestic Manastambh. The manastambh which was originally built in 1920 was reconstructed in 1978 by the Mirji Family.

To renovate the temple and create additional facility for immediate requirement, ASSF committed to provide help of an approximate sum of Rs. 7 lakhs for the further development of the temple within this financial year.



7. Acharya Shantisagar Smarak Bhavan, Shraavanbelagola

Based on Shanti Shala concept, the Acharya Shantisagar Smarak Bhavan, Shraavanbelagola has been renovated and decorated. An art gallery and a library have been constructed inside the Bhavan. The expanse of Acharya Shantisagar ji's life has been depicted in 35 newly created paintings and their descriptions have been written in the Hindi, Kannada and English languages.

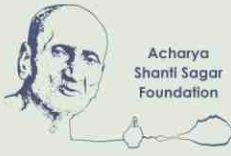


8. Shanti Shala, Shyam Nagar, Jaipur

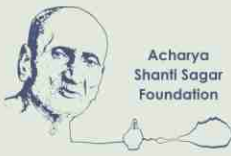

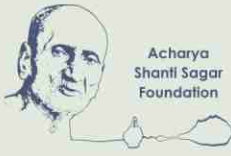

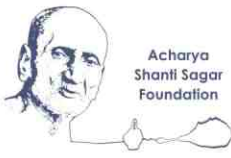

PUBLIC WELFARE





1. Flood relief services, in Yamgarni, Budiyaal, Ugar, Shirgur, Kusnal and Yarnal Villages of Belagavi District

During August 2019, a flood shook the Belagavi district and its adjoining areas. Most of the villages in Belagavi and adjoining districts were completely submerged in water for more than 10–12 days. Many families lost their houses and many houses were completely damaged. Household articles, provisions were also lost or damaged in the gushing water. The people of these villages, whose major occupation is farming, also lost their standing crops.

The members of the foundation made a survey of the effects of the flood affected villages and the team were shocked to see the lives of people with no food, clothing and shelter to stay.

Having said the above, we got into action and decided to make their daily living better until the water levels come down.

The relief work was carried out in a phased manner by the Foundation's networks and volunteers of Bangalore and Belgaum and its surrounding areas. The volunteers of the Bangalore and Belagavi Dist. prepared and distributed survival kits which include basic utilities like water, food items, clothing and medical kits, to help the people in distress.

Heavy rains had flooded many parts of the North Karnataka, leading to deaths and disruption in road and rail connectivity which made this relief work all the way more challenging.

With the help of volunteers and local support, we distributed 2000 kits (consisting of food materials) and 500 Kits consisting of blanket, dhoti, sarees, shirts and towel, to the flood victims.

The most satisfying part of this initiative was that each and every kit was handed over personally to the individual to ensure that the help reaches to the right person.

A total of 2500 kits were distributed in the following Villages: -

3. Repairing of flood affected Jain Temples

For repairing the flood damaged Jain temples, Acharya Shanti Sagar Foundation met and thoroughly discussed with the temple management committee and made donations to the temple committee for repairing of the temple structure.

4. Free Medical Camp - Shri Shivashakthi Peetha (Parama Pujya Shri Basavaprasad Mahaswami Shri Kshethra) Irkalmatha had organized a Free Medical Camp at Irkalmatha on 14th March, 2019 on occasion of annual Jatra Mahothsava (Car Festival).

More than 463 beneficiaries were examined and treated in the medical camp. The Doctors from Sapthagiri Hospital conducted the Heart screening tests, Neuro Tests and Nephro, Height & Weight for 463 people were conducted in the camp. 5 people were suggested to undergo Angiogram and 15 people were advised to go further treatment for kidney stones.

Dr. Rudre Gowda, Eye Hospital Ophthalmologist conducted the eye screening for more than 463 beneficiaries and 35 beneficiaries were advised to undergo cataract operations. The operations will be conducted by 'Rudre Gowda Eye Hospital' free of cost to the Beneficiaries.

Acharya Shanti Sagar Foundation distributed 137 nos. of reading spectacles for the required beneficiaries. The spectacles were sourced by 'Rudre Gowda Eye Hospital' in association with Shri Venkateshwara Opticals, Deodurga, Raichur, Karnataka.



5. Free Heart Checkup and Blood Donation Camp at Karnataka Jain Association, Bangalore on 17th April, 2019

Acharya Shanti Sagar Foundation had organized a free Heart Checkup and Blood Donation camp at Karnataka Jain Association, Bangalore on 17th April, 2019 on the occasion of Mahaveer Jayanthi - 2019 in association with Karnataka Jain Association, Banashankari Jain Yuva Geleyara Balaga, SSNMC Super Specialty Hospital, Lions Blood Bank and Students of the Mothikhane Thimmappaiah Jain Student's Hostel.

More than 178 people visited the camp for their medical assessment by a panel of doctors comprising General Physician, Surgeon and Paramedical operators. BMI test and Heart Screening (ECG & ECCO) was conducted and the report was given to them on the same day with medical advice. Also, BMI test report was also given to the beneficiaries along with medical advice. In the Blood Donation camp, 78 units of blood were collected from the donors.



6. Free Multi Specialty Healthcare camp organized at Dadagadapura, Malavalli Taluk, Mandya Dist. on 30th June, 2019

Acharya Shanti Sagar Foundation had organized a free Multi Specialty Healthcare camp at Dadagadapura, Malavalli Taluk, Mandya Dist. on 30th June, 2019 in association with Karnataka Jain Association, ADD Foundation, Lohia Vichara Vedike, Karnataka Marwari Youth Federation, Sapthagiri Multi Specialty Hospital and Lakshmi Hospital.

More than 1100 people took registration in the camp for their medical assessment by a panel of doctors comprising of ENT Specialists, Dentists, Pediatricians, Oncologists, Ophthalmologists, Dermatologists, Orthopedists, General Physicians & Surgeons. The relevant test for General health conditions, derma and dental, ortho, tumor detection, Eye, BP, Blood Sugar and Heart Screening (ECG) were conducted and free medicines were provided. Spectacles were provided free of to the beneficiaries who were diagnosed with sight issues. Also, cases like knee replacement/surgery, Heart ailments and Tumor detections which needed further medications were recommended for further free treatments at Bangalore.

The local media covered the event exclusively and carried the reports in their newspaper.

Our team visited these above schools personally and accessed the number of students studying in these schools and nearly 500 students were issued with books and stationery materials from our Foundation.

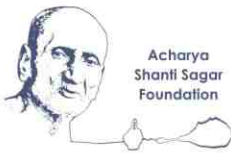

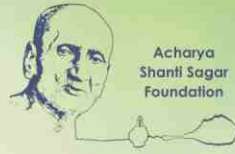
Jain Vidwat Sammelan

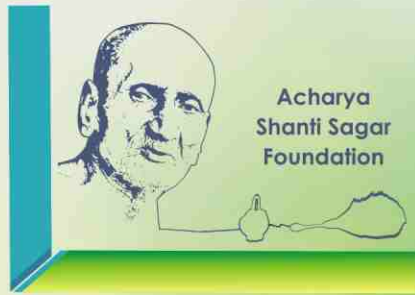
6. Charitra Chakravarty Acharya Shanti Sagar Aarogya Shala
